General Information

Congress has provided a total of \$10.41 billion for Louisiana's recovery. These funds come in the form of Community Development Block Grants, which are administered on the federal level by HUD.

The Louisiana Commissioner of Administration created the Disaster Recovery Unit (DRU) within the Division's Office of Community Development to administer these relief funds. The Office of Community Development (OCD) is the State agency that has administered the CDBG program for the State of Louisiana for 24 years. The Louisiana Recovery Authority (LRA), the Governor's state-wide coordinating body for all recovery efforts, has developed priorities for the utilization of CDBG Disaster Funds. These priorities are detailed in the State's *Action Plan for the Use of Disaster Recovery Funds* approved by HUD. This Action Plan, along with several subsequent amendments, outlines the programs and methods the State of Louisiana will use to administer this award. Eligible Activities and Waivers for the CDBG Program

The February 13, 2006 Federal Register (Volume 71, Number 29) specifies that "these funds be used only for disaster relief, long-term recovery, and restoration of infrastructure...." This document also details waivers to certain CDBG requirements and additional waivers were published in the June 14, 2006 Federal Register (Volume 71, Number 114).

Basic eligible activities under the CDBG program are identified in Sections 570.201 and 570.482 of the Code of Federal Regulations. Ineligible activities are identified in Section 570.207. These may be viewed online at http://www.access.gpo.gov/nara/cfr/waisidx_04/24cfr570_04.html.

Eligible Applicants and Activities for FEMA-ineligible Program

The State of Louisiana has committed to providing school districts with funding for repairs that are ineligible under the FEMA Public Assistance Program (PA), including but not limited to uninsured and underinsured damages, insurance deductibles and improvements for code compliance, if they are determined to be critical to continued delivery and or protection of vital public services by state and local government entities in accordance with criteria established by the LRA.

To be eligible for these funds, each project must be in compliance with all CDBG regulations. Areas that require specific attention by the applicant include those regarding HUD environmental clearance regulations, those related to labor standards compliance (especially the Davis-Bacon requirements), and adherence to state and federal procurement regulations.

Public Primary and Secondary Education projects requesting funds from this program must meet the following eligibility guidelines:

1. Projects demonstrate that they are not eligible for FEMA PA or any other source of funds;
2. Projects have a substantial return on investment (ROI);

3. That the funding to be provided is for cases of critical needs based on their meeting criteria developed by the LRA;
4. That the funding be provided to parishes which have adopted the latest available base flood elevations of the FEMA Flood Recovery Guidance, unless exceptions are granted by the LRA based on reasonable alternatives where safety is not minimized;
5. That the funding be provided to parishes or communities which have adopted, implemented or are in the process of implementing the new statewide building code standards adopted in the 2005 1st Extraordinary Session of the Louisiana Legislature;
6. That the funding be provided to communities for projects recommended through a broad community planning process; and
7. That the projects receiving funding follow the best design for delivery of services in light of the population shifts and changed circumstances of many Louisiana communities;
8. That a project demonstrate that it is the most efficient and cost effective way to rebuild the infrastructure, or that the applicant has considered alternate methods of rebuilding to achieve the greatest efficiency of the infrastructure to serve the local as well as regional needs of the community as a result of the Public Assistance repairs or reconstruction; and
9. That each infrastructure project considers and/or proposes a mitigation plan to minimize damage in the event of future floods or hurricanes.

A certification form for the above requirements is included in the application package.

All funds to be used in conjunction with each project must be identified.

OCD/DRU Application Instructions for FEMA–Ineligible Costs

You must mark the appropriate box at the top of the form to indicate whether this is the original application or an amended application. An amended application must be submitted each time there is a change to the project (example: when a new Project Worksheet (PW) is obligated for this project or an existing PW is versioned).

In the **Applicant Name** box indicate the name, address, phone and fax numbers of the entity requesting match funds (ex: St. Bernard Parish Sheriff's Office).

In the **Project Name** box indicate the name and street address of the project (ex: St. Bernard Parish Courthouse, #2 Courthouse Square, Chalmette, LA 70043).

In the **Contact Person** box indicate the name, address, phone number and e-mail address of the person in the applicant's office to be contacted regarding this application.

In the **Consultant Contact** box indicate the name, address, phone number and e-mail address of the Administrative Consultant for this project if one was hired by the applicant.

In the **Engineering/Architectural Firm** box indicate the name, address, phone number and e-mail address of the engineering/architectural firm for this project if one was hired by the applicant.

In the **Status of Project** box indicate the status of the project, indicating start and end dates as applicable, as follows;

- a) **CONSTRUCTION COMPLETED:** Check here if the project has been completed prior to application submittal, and give dates of start and completion of work.
- b) **UNDER CONSTRUCTION:** Check here if the project is under construction, and provide date of start and anticipated date of completion of work.
- c) **CONSTRUCTION NOT STARTED:** Check here if the project has not begun construction prior to submission of application, and indicate anticipated start date.
- d) **NON-CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES ONLY:** check here if the project does not include any construction activity (e.g., contents only).

Indicate the total dollar amount of Project Funds expected from each funding source. Round all amounts to the nearest dollar on all forms. The **TOTAL FUNDS** amount should equal the total project cost. Identify the funding source and the status of each of those funds (committed, applied for, etc.).

Give a brief description of the project (ex: repair storm damage to Parish Courthouse).

The applicant's **Certifying Official** must sign and date the form. Type the **Certifying Official's** name and title in the appropriate box.

Obligated FEMA-PA Project Worksheet Form Instructions

From the **most recent** PW provide the following information:

In Column A list the obligated project worksheet number(s). Indicate the related disaster by preceding the PW number with a **K** for Hurricane Katrina or an **R** for Hurricane Rita.

In Column B list the obligated amount as shown on the most current Project Worksheet.

In Column C list the amount provided by FEMA for administration.

In Column D list any amounts not approved by FEMA as being eligible for Public Assistance, along with a brief description of ineligible activity. Provide a copy of the appropriate pages from the most recent PW to document amounts shown.

Budget Cost Summary Form Instructions

Column A: Definitions of these activities may be found in 24 CFR 570.201, or at: http://www.access.gpo.gov/nara/cfr/waisidx_04/24cfr570_04.html.

Column B: List the obligated amount as shown on the most current PW.

Column B "Total Funds" should equal all PW amounts related to this project.

Column C: List the amount requested from CDBG funds within your Districts' allocated amount.

Column C "Total Funds" should equal all CDBG funds requested for this project.

Column D: List all insurance proceeds applied against each Activity.

Column D "Total Funds" should equal **all insurance proceeds expected**, including NFIP and other insurance, for this project/facility.

Column E: List any other funds being applied to this project.

For example, if you intend to repair a building you must include the design costs, construction costs, inspection costs, etc. in the "Public Facilities and Improvements" column. The total project cost should be the same as the "Total Funds" amount.

Supplemental Information Instructions

NOTE: The Benefit Area is either "Community-wide" (meaning the entire district) if a school accepts students from anywhere in the district, or "Target Area" if the school has specific attendance zones. The "Target Area" would be the attendance zone of the school.

Item 1: Enter the name, telephone number and district number of each State Senator whose district includes all or part of the benefit area. If the project has district-wide benefit, enter any State Senator whose district includes at least part of the district. If the project involves a target area(s), enter the names of only those State Senators representing the target area(s). - Item 2: Enter the name, telephone number and district number of each State Representative whose district includes all or part of the benefit area. If the project has district-wide benefit, enter any State Representative whose district includes at least part of the district. - Item 3: Enter the name, telephone number and district number of each Congressman whose district includes all or part of the benefit area. If the project has district-wide benefit, enter any Congressman whose district includes at least part of the district. If the project involves a target area(s), enter the names of only those Congressmen representing the target area(s). - Item 4: Enter the Census Tract number(s) of the physical location of the project (Target Area). This information can be found by entering the school's street address at the following web site: www.census.gov/main/www/cen2000.html.
- Item 5: Check off "Community-wide" if the proposed project involves a community-wide project and list the zip code of the project. **The zip code is the location of City Hall.** Check off "Target Area" if the project involves a target-area. If the target area(s) do not have a name, please provide a brief geographical description of the area such as "western portion of the city". **The zip code(s) should be where the majority of the construction funds will be spent for each target area.**

Activity Beneficiary Form Instructions

This form must be completed for all proposed activities identified on the Budget/Cost Summary Form. Beneficiaries for each activity must be listed separately, and a copy of the FY 2006 Income Limit chart is provided for use in completing this form.

If there is more than one target area, then this information must be determined for each target area independently of the others. An *Activity Beneficiary Form* for each target area and an additional form with combined totals from all target areas must be submitted. The information needed for this form will be taken from census data and/or a local survey. Census data must be used whenever possible and a local survey must be conducted for project areas that do not coincide with census data.

Our office must be contacted for a copy of the HUD-recommended survey procedures should a survey be required. The Applicant is required to maintain this survey data for four years following project completion and closeout.

You must mark the appropriate box on the *Activity Beneficiary* form that corresponds to the data included on each form submitted, i.e.: **Community-Wide, Target Area** or **Combined**. In the space provided following “Target Area”, indicate target area (1, 2, etc.) to which the data on the form corresponds. The **Applicant Name** space and the **Project Name** space should contain the same names as those on the first page of the application.

The following definitions must be used when completing this form:

Not Low/Moderate Income – persons, families, or households whose combined annual income exceeds eighty percent of the parish median income.

Moderate Income – persons, families, or households whose combined annual income exceeds fifty percent but does not exceed eighty percent of the parish median income. (Note: Income Limits Table refers to this category as “Low-Income”).

Low Income – persons, families, or households whose combined annual income exceeds thirty percent but does not exceed fifty percent of the parish median income. (Note: Income Limits Table refers to this category as “Very Low Income”).

Extremely Low Income – persons, families, or households whose combined annual income does not exceed thirty percent of the parish median income. (Note: Income Limits Table refers to this category as “30% of Median”).

American Indian or Alaskan Native – A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment.

Asian – A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.

Black or African American – A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander – A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.

White – A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.

Hispanic or Latino – A person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

Please refer to the definitions above concerning the racial/ethnic categories listed in this section. Enter the number of persons in the appropriate racial category under the “Total” column. Of the number in the “Total” column, enter the number of persons that are of Hispanic or Latino ethnicity in the “Hispanic” column.

When identifying the number of persons by income category, each person should be included in only one category. For example, the number of extremely low income persons should not be counted in the number of low income persons. Each income category is self-contained and is not inclusive of other income categories. The number of persons identified as within moderate income limits, within low income limits, and within extremely low income limits should equal the total the number of low/moderate income persons. To calculate the percentage of persons for each income group, you should divide the number of persons in the income category by the total number of persons surveyed and multiply the result by 100. This percentage should be calculated to two decimal points.

When a local survey is involved, this form must identify all beneficiaries, not just those surveyed. If all families were not surveyed, projections must be made based on the survey results.

Project Description Form

Provide a description of the project for which you are requesting funds or attach a copy of the appropriate page of the most recent version PW(s) including the description of damage. The description should include the following items (when applicable). This list is not comprehensive.

- Identify the proposed improvements, current size/capacity of and area served, location of the improvements, etc.
- Identify which work items are associated with which funding sources.
- Indicate whether your project will require property acquisition and if so, the approximate number of parcels to be acquired.
- Describe how your project relates to the existing structure(s).
- Identify who will retain ownership after completion of the project.
- Describe the physical boundaries of the target area in relation to the beneficiaries of the project.

Attach additional sheets if necessary.

Architect's/Engineer's Cost Estimate

All proposed activities must be accompanied by a detailed cost estimate prepared and signed by a Professional Architect/Engineer licensed in the State of Louisiana. The cost estimate shall contain the cost of construction, engineering fees, and related costs. The construction estimate shall be a listing of construction items (as a bid proposal), estimated quantity, unit of measure, unit price, and amount.

Architectural/Engineering fees shall be identified by type in a line item format. Typical items include basic services, resident project representative, surveying (topographic), surveying (property acquisition), construction staking, geotechnical investigation, and testing. Written justification must be provided for all architectural/engineering services other than basic services and resident project representative. The justification is to contain an explanation of why the service is needed and how the proposed fee was derived. If multiple funding sources are to be used for this project, line items should indicate source of funds to be used.

These funds must match those identified on the Budget/Cost Summary form.

Statement of Assurances

The applicant's **Certifying Official** must sign and date the form. Type the **Certifying Official's** name and title in the appropriate box.

Applicant/Recipient Disclosure/Update Report Instructions

Public reporting burden for this collection of information is estimated to average 2.0 hours per response, including the time for reviewing instructions, searching existing data sources, gathering and maintaining the data needed, and completing and reviewing the collection of information. This agency may not conduct or sponsor, and a person is not required to respond to, a collection information unless that collection displays a valid OMB control number.

Privacy Act Statement. Except for Social Security Numbers (SSNs) and Employer Identification Numbers (EINs), the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is authorized to collect all the information required by this form under section 102 of the Department of Housing and Urban Development Reform Act of 1989, 42 U.S.C. 3531. Disclosure of SSNs and EINs is optional. The SSN or EIN is used as a unique identifier. The information you provide will enable HUD to carry out its responsibilities under Sections 102(b), (c), and (d) of the Department of Housing and Urban Development Reform Act of 1989, Pub. L. 101-235, approved December 15, 1989. These provisions will help ensure greater accountability and integrity in the provision of certain types of assistance administered by HUD. They will also help ensure that HUD assistance for a specific housing project under Section 102(d) is not more than is necessary to make the project feasible after taking account of other government assistance. HUD will make available to the public all applicant disclosure reports for five years in the case of applications for competitive assistance, and for generally three years in the case of other applications. Update reports will be made available along with the disclosure reports, but in no case for a period generally less than three years. All reports, both initial reports and update reports, will be made available in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. §552) and HUD's implementing regulations at 24 CFR Part 15. HUD will use the information in evaluating individual assistance applications and in performing internal administrative analyses to assist in the management of specific HUD programs. The information will also be used in making the determination under Section 102(d) whether HUD assistance for a specific housing project is more than is necessary to make the project feasible after taking account of other government assistance. You must provide all the required information. Failure to provide any required information may delay the processing of your application, and may result in sanctions and penalties, including imposition of the administrative and civil money penalties specified under 24 CFR §4.38.

Note: This form only covers assistance made available by the Department. States and units of general local government that carry out responsibilities under Sections 102(b) and (c) of the Reform Act must develop their own procedures for complying with the Act.

Overview.

A. Coverage. You must complete this report if:

- (1) You are applying for assistance from HUD for a specific project or activity **and** you have received, or expect to receive, assistance from HUD in excess of \$200,000 during the during the fiscal year;
- (2) You are updating a prior report as discussed below; or
- (3) You are submitting an application for assistance to an entity other than HUD, a State or local government if the application is required by statute or regulation to be submitted to HUD for approval or for any other purpose.

B. Update reports (filed by "Recipients" of HUD Assistance):

General. All recipients of covered assistance must submit update reports to the Department to reflect substantial changes to the initial applicant disclosure reports.

Line-by-Line Instructions.

Applicant/Recipient Information.

All applicants for HUD competitive assistance, must complete the information required in blocks 1-5 of form HUD-2880:

1. Enter the full name, address, city, State, zip code, and telephone number (including area code) of the applicant/recipient. Where the applicant/recipient is an individual, the last name, first name, and middle initial must be entered.
2. Entry of the applicant/recipient's SSN or EIN, as appropriate, is optional.
3. Applicants enter the HUD program name under which the assistance is being requested.
4. Applicants enter the amount of HUD assistance that is being requested. Recipients enter the amount of HUD assistance that has been provided and to which the update report relates. The amounts are those stated in the application or award documentation. **NOTE:** In the case of assistance that is provided pursuant to contract over a period of time (such as project-based assistance under section 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937), the amount of assistance to be reported includes all amounts that are to be provided over the term of the contract, irrespective of when they are to be received.

5. Applicants enter the name and full address of the project or activity for which the HUD assistance is sought. Recipients enter the name and full address of the HUD-assisted project or activity to which the update report relates. The most appropriate government identifying number must be used (e.g., RFP No.; IFB No.; grant announcement No.; or contract, grant, or loan No.) Include prefixes.

Part I. Threshold Determinations - Applicants Only

Part I contains information to help the applicant determine whether the remainder of the form must be completed. **Recipients filing Update Reports should not complete this Part.**

If the answer to **either** questions 1 or 2 is No, the applicant need not complete Parts II and III of the report, but must sign the certification at the end of the form.

Part II. Other Government Assistance and Expected Sources and Uses of Funds.

- A. Other Government Assistance.** This Part is to be completed by both applicants and recipients for assistance and recipients filing update reports. Applicants and recipients must report any other government assistance involved in the project or activity for which assistance is sought. Applicants and recipients must report any other government assistance involved in the project or activity. Other government assistance is defined in note 4 on the last page. For purposes of this definition, other government assistance is expected to be made available if, based on an assessment of all the circumstances involved, there are reasonable grounds to anticipate that the assistance will be forthcoming.

Both applicant and recipient disclosures must include all other government assistance involved with the HUD assistance, as well as any other government assistance that was made available before the request, but that has continuing vitality at the time of the request. Examples of this latter category include tax credits that provide for a number of years of tax benefits, and grant assistance that continues to benefit the project at the time of the assistance request.

The following information must be provided:

1. Enter the name and address, city, State, and zip code of the government agency making the assistance available.
 2. State the type of other government assistance (e.g., loan, grant, loan insurance).
 3. Enter the dollar amount of the other government assistance that is, or is expected to be, made available with respect to the project or activities for which the HUD assistance is sought (applicants) or has been provided (recipients).
 4. Uses of funds. Each reportable use of funds must clearly identify the purpose to which they are to be put. Reasonable aggregations may be used, such as "total structure" to include a number of structural costs, such as roof, elevators, exterior masonry, etc.
- B. Non-Government Assistance. Note that the applicant and recipient disclosure report must specify all expected sources and uses of funds - both from HUD **and any other source** - that have been or are to be, made available for the project or activity. Non-government sources of funds typically include (but are not limited to) foundations and private contributors.

Part III. Interested Parties.

This Part is to be completed by both applicants and recipients filing update reports. Applicants must provide information on:

1. All developers, contractors, or consultants involved in the application for the assistance or in the planning, development, or implementation of the project or activity and
2. any other person who has a financial interest in the project or activity for which the assistance is sought that exceeds \$50,000 or 10 percent of the assistance (whichever is lower).

Note: A financial interest means any financial involvement in the project or activity, including (but not limited to) situations in which an individual or entity has an equity interest in the project or activity, shares in any profit on resale or any distribution of surplus cash or other assets of the project or activity, or receives compensation for any goods or services provided in connection with the project or activity. Residency of an individual in housing for which assistance is being sought is not, by itself, considered a covered financial interest.

The information required below must be provided.

1. Enter the full names and addresses. If the person is an entity, the listing must include the full name and address of the entity as well as the CEO. Please list all names alphabetically.
2. Entry of the Social Security Number (SSN) or Employee Identification Number (EIN), as appropriate, for each person listed is optional.
3. Enter the type of participation in the project or activity for each person listed: i.e., the person's specific role in the project (e.g., contractor, consultant, planner, investor).
4. Enter the financial interest in the project or activity for each person listed. The interest must be expressed both as a dollar amount and as a percentage of the amount of the HUD assistance involved.

Note that if any of the source/use information required by this report has been provided elsewhere in this application package, the applicant need not repeat the information, but need only refer to the form and location to incorporate it into this report. (It is likely that some of the information required by this report has been provided on SF 424A, and on various budget forms accompanying the application.) If this report requires information beyond that provided elsewhere in the application package, the applicant must include in this report all the additional information required.

Recipients must submit an update report for any change in previously disclosed sources and uses of funds as provided in Section I.D.5., above.

Notes:

1. All citations are to 24 CFR Part 4, which was published in the Federal Register. [April 1, 1996, at 63 Fed. Reg. 14448.]
2. Assistance means any contract, grant, loan, cooperative agreement, or other form of assistance, including the insurance or guarantee of a loan or mortgage, that is provided with respect to a specific project or activity under a program administered by the Department. The term does not include contracts, such as procurements contracts, that are subject to the Fed. Acquisition Regulation (FAR) (48 CFR Chapter 1).
3. See 24 CFR §4.9 for detailed guidance on how the threshold is calculated.
4. "Other government assistance" is defined to include any loan, grant, guarantee, insurance, payment, rebate, subsidy, credit, tax benefit, or any other form of direct or indirect assistance from the Federal government (other than that requested from HUD in the application), a State, or a unit of general local government, or any agency or instrumentality thereof, that is, or is expected to be made, available with respect to the project or activities for which the assistance is sought.
5.
