**A. Overview:**

This Substantial Action Plan Amendment No. 30 amends allocations to First Time Homebuyer Program budget and the LIHTC/CDBG Piggyback Program. This amendment is considered substantial as it re-allocates more than 15% of the funds in a program.

**B. Reallocation of Funds for Existing Programs:**

A. LIHTC/CDBG Piggyback

The LIHTC/CDBG Piggyback budget is increased to \$590,070,455.60 in order to fund additional eligible activities. This program was created in the Initial Action Plan and amended in Amendments 4, 5, 23, and 26.

B. First Time Homebuyer Pilot Program

The First Time Homebuyer program budget is reduced to \$2,524,291.40 because funds have been de-obligated from activities that are completed and closed out. This program was created in the Initial Action plan and amended in Amendment 26.
